All owners and exhibitors must be current members of the Paso Fino Horse Association (please make sure your membership is current, you may renew at www.pfha.org) and all horses must be registered or have a current show validation certificate with PFHA. SHOW ENTRY INFORMATION

SHOW SECRETARY: Andy Smith, Winchester, KY. Pre-Entries must be received by June 12, 2026. Entries received after June 12 will pay a \$25 late fee per horse. Entries should be emailed; scan and send to andysmithpkt@yahoo.com. You only need to send the entry form (front and back) with all information filled in. All exhibitors should use the standard PFHA entry form with separate signature page for emailed entries.

At time of check in at the show, you must leave a signed check (made payable to Piedmont PFHA) or a completed credit card authorization form. ENTRY NUMBERS WILL NOT BE ISSUED BY THE SHOW OFFICE WITHOUT EITHER A SIGNED CHECK OR A CC AUTHORIZATION FORM ON FILE. Credit card payments are subject to a 4% service fee.

Bring all necessary paperwork with you at check-in, including registration copies, PFHA & USEF membership card numbers for owners and exhibitors, vaccine records for flu & rhino vaccines, and coggins test copies. Health certificates (30 days) will be required for any horse coming from outside of NC for the show, and these must be brought with the horse and shown upon arrival to the show grounds and upon check in at the show office.

Send a stabling form that includes all horses and owners that are to be stabled together, as well as any additional shavings you wish to pre-order, to Milda Minter at pasofinotrainer@gmail.com. Three bags of shavings are included with each horse stall. Please only list the EXTRA SHAVINGS that you wish to order on the stabling form. Shavings that come with your stall and any shavings you order before the show will be at your stall upon arrival. (you are allowed to bring in bagged shavings or pelleted bedding also) When you submit your entry by the June 12 deadline, you do not have to enter all your classes. You must enter at least one class on a completed entry form to be considered "pre-entered." You may add or switch classes at the show with the show secretary. **The show office will be open from 9 am to 5 pm on Wednesday, starting at 9am on Thursday, and throughout the weekend.**

IMPORTANT SHOW INFORMATION FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

Please note that the class schedule is different each day. Pay close attention to your class numbers to make sure you enter the proper classes for your division.

All classes will be conducted and judged under current Paso Fino Horse Association and USEF rules and regulations.

This show is sanctioned by USEF as a Lite show. Anyone who signs the entry blank as a trainer must have a current USEF competing membership and be Safe Sport trained before the show. This applies to all adults aged 18 years or older.

Every entry blank must be signed on the trainer line. Therefore, if you are an owner or amateur who is showing without a trainer, or sign as a parent of a youth who is showing without a trainer, you must also sign on the trainer line and therefore you will be required to have a USEF competing membership and be Safe Sport trained before the show. Please visit www.usef.org to join or renew your membership and complete the Safe Sport training before arriving at the show.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.USEF.org.

Pay attention to paddock announcements. Some classes may be small or have no exhibitors, so at times the schedule will move very fast. We will make every attempt to make sure exhibitors are notified of classes in the arena, but exhibitors are responsible for being ready to show when their classes are called to the arena. Once classes are called into the arena, there will be a short gate hold, and then the gate will close. **Once the entry gate has been closed, additional horses will not be permitted to enter and the class will be judged with those present. Entry fees will not be refunded in the case of missed classes.** If you need to scratch a class or classes, please notify the paddock master or show secretary before your class is due to enter the ring. Entry fees may be credited to your account if scratches are made in a timely manner before the class runs.

DIRECTIONS TO THE FACILITY: The Tryon International Equestrian Center is located at 25 International Blvd, Mill Spring, NC, 28756. From Highway 74 take exit 170 for Pea Ridge Rd and follow signs to TIEC. Enter the facility at the main entrance (past the Overlook Mountain Lodge), then turn left to follow the signs to the barn area for unloading. Maps of the facility and stall area will be provided to exhibitors.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS & INFORMATION

ADMISSION OF HORSES: Stalls at regular rate will be available on Tuesday, June 16, 2025, and must be vacated by Monday, June 22, 2025. Stalls are available on Monday, June 15, for early arrival for an additional fee and by prior arrangement. Horses may be stabled only in the stalls designated for their owner by show management. Use of other stalls not designated to you may result in additional fees.

ARENA FOOTING: Sand mixture compacted to a firm standard. The competition arena is 120 x 165 ft on the floor with sponsor tables on each side. Our show will be held in the indoor complex at TIEC.

AWARDS: Ribbons up to 6th place will be awarded in regular classes. Ribbons will be awarded up to 4th place in championship classes. An honorable mention will be announced for each class. Awards will be announced and presented in reverse order, so the first place horse will be last to be called. Trophies and other prizes will be awarded.

BICYCLES, MOPEDS, SCOOTERS, SKATEBOARDS: Bicycles, mopeds, scooters, skateboards, or any other personal transportation with wheels (including wheeled shoes) may be used **WITH CAUTION** on the show grounds but may **NOT** be ridden or used inside the show arena or on the concourse (excluding necessary and approved medical equipment). This is for safety of horses and people. **Anyone violating this policy will be subject to monetary fines and to confiscation of the equipment until the show is over.** Anyone riding or using these devices anywhere on the show grounds in a reckless or unsafe manner, that could cause injury to a horse or person, will be subject to fines or confiscation of the equipment until the show is over.

BITS: Bits may be checked after any class for the top 3 placements after the horses exit the show arena. Exhibitors should be prepared to drop bits for the show steward and should have an extra handler available if necessary for your horse. A small paddock area will be designated for bit checks.

CAMPERS/RVS: All campers or motorhomes must be parked in designated spaces, which must be reserved and paid through TIEC by calling (828) 863-1015 or lodging@tryon.com. Use code PASO26 to get a 20% discount off the daily rate of RV spaces.

CHANGES/CANCELLATIONS: Management reserves the right to add, split, combine, cancel, or run concurrently any class or classes as needed for the show, or to reschedule classes after notification to exhibitors. Management also reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show. Management is not responsible for cancellations due to severe weather or other emergencies.

CLASS CALLS: Every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system. However, due to unforeseen problems with any mechanical device, the PA system and paddock calls must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his/her horse is at the gate at the prescribed time.

COGGINS/HEALTH PAPERS: In accordance with North Carolina state law, all horses on the grounds must have a current negative Coggins test certificate (within 12 months). A copy of the certificate must be on file in the show office. In addition, a copy must be posted on the stall door for inspection by the State Veterinarian. All non-showing horses on the grounds must be listed on an entry blank and present a coggins certificate as listed above. Any horse not in compliance must be removed from the grounds—no exceptions! A health certificate dated within 30 days prior to the end of the show is required for all out of state horses. Each horse must have proof of flu/rhino vaccines within the past 6 months.

CONCESSIONS: There will be a coffee/beverage/snack trailer set up outside the arena entrance and food trucks will be available each day. There are also several restaurants located on the grounds.

DAMAGE: The Tryon International Equestrian Center holds individual owners and exhibitors responsible for damages incurred by them or their agents to barns or other properties on the show grounds and will bill them accordingly. The Piedmont PFHA, the Legacy at Tryon Horse Show, and the show management, personnel, or volunteers will in no way be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. It will be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, its management, and the W NC Ag Center blameless for any loss or accident to his/her horse(s) or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise. The Legacy at Tryon Horse Show, show management or personnel, or TIEC will not be responsible or liable for injuries sustained in any way to exhibitors, spectators, employees, or any other interested parties.

DISABILITY: If an individual needs an accommodation under the American Disabilities Act, please submit the request, along with the documentation of the disability and need for accommodation, to the show chairman.

DISCOURTESY: Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom, may disqualify the horse and cause the owner to forfeit his/her entry fee and other fees.

DISPOSAL OF MEDICAL WASTE: Sharps containers are provided in convenient locations throughout the barns for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. Show management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal.

DOGS ON COMPETITION GROUNDS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained at all times. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted on a horse.

DRUG TESTING: Horses may be randomly drug tested through the USEF drug testing program. Trainers and owners are expected to be courteous and compliant to testing personnel. Exhibitors are not required to pay drug testing fees.

EMERGENCY CARE: Information about local Urgent Care facilities and local hospitals will be available at the show office. There will be a dedicated EMT at our show during show hours.

ENTRIES: Entries must be received by June 12 to avoid paying a late fee. Entries must be complete and include signatures and form of payment, either a check or credit card authorization form. A check may be substituted at the show as payment so long as a CC authorization form has been submitted with the entries. **See page 2 of the prize list for submission information.**

FACILITY: Tryon International Equestrian Center, 25 International Blvd, Mill Spring, NC, 28756. Visit their web site at tryon.com for details, pictures, and maps of the facility. General phone 828-863-1000.

FARRIER: The name and number of a show farrier will be posted in the barns and at the show office.

GOLF CARTS: Golf carts are located at TIEC and must be reserved directly through their office. Contact the lodging office at lodging@tryon.com or call 828-863-1015 to reserve these. You will be required to give a credit card number to guarantee your reservation. **RESERVE YOUR CARTS EARLY BECAUSE AVAILABILITY IS NOT GUARANTEED.** You may bring your own golf cart from home.

HOLD HARMLESS: Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to him/her, his/her horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise. All exhibitors must sign a release form.

HOTEL INFORMATION: For any lodging on the TIEC grounds, including hotels, cabins, or RV spaces, use code PASO26 to receive 20% off the standard daily rate (3 night minimum applies). Any reservations must be made directly through TIEC, either online at <https://tryon-lodging.mydirectstay.com/> or by calling (828) 863-1015 for the lodging office.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

MUSIC: Please be aware that loud music in the barns during show hours can prevent exhibitors from hearing paddock calls for their classes. If complaints are made regarding loud music, exhibitors are expected to comply with show management's request to reduce the volume for the sake of other exhibitors.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: If horses are on the show grounds for any reason that are not entered in the show, those horses must meet all health requirements required by the show, including flu/rhino vaccine records, coggins tests, and health papers (if from out of state). All non-showing horses must be listed on an entry form with the show office.

PARKING: Horse trailer parking is not permitted in the barn area. **Horse trailers and vans must be parked in designated trailer parking areas cross the highway from the arena complex (maps will be provided).** At all times a fire lane around the barns must be kept clear. Any vehicles or trailers blocking emergency access or parked around the barns may be towed at the owner's expense. Cars and trucks may park in the parking lots behind or in front of the arena complex or near barns 1 & 2.

QUESTIONS: Any and all questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management, whose decision shall be final.

REFUNDS: Owners will be responsible for payment of stall fees after June 12 unless a refund request is accompanied by a veterinarian excuse.

RETURNED CHECKS OR DECLINED CREDIT CARDS: All checks returned for non-payment, or credit cards that are declined, will be charged a handling fee and must be replaced by cash, certified check, or cashier's check within 2 weeks of notification.

RING CONDUCT: All riders shall be properly attired and horses presented according to the PFHA & USEF rules. Attendants should be neatly dressed. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those persons having official or requested duties to perform.

SHAVINGS: Each horse stall is priced with 3 bags of shavings included. Additional shavings may be purchased through show management. Text the barn manager at 336-225-0214 to order shavings, or order these at the show office. You may also pre-order extra shavings on the stabling form you send with your entries, and these will be at your stalls when you arrive. **PLEASE DO NOT INCLUDE YOUR FIRST 3 BAGS OF SHAVINGS THAT COME WITH YOUR STALLS ON THE STABLING FORM, ONLY INCLUDE ANY EXTRAS THAT YOU WISH TO PRE-ORDER.** Exhibitors are allowed to bring bagged shavings or pelleted bedding onto the grounds for their personal stalls. All stalls at TIEC have rubber mats.

SHOW OFFICE: The show office will be open on Wednesday, June 17, for exhibitor check-ins from 9am until 5pm. **From 9am until noon on Wednesday, check-in is available for sponsors only.** It will also be open at 9am on Thursday, and 1 hour before show time on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The show office will close 30 minutes after the completion of the last class each day. Please check out with the show secretary to verify your bill upon completion of your last class for the weekend.

SPONSORSHIPS: Sponsorship packages and class sponsorships are available. Some packages may already be sold. Contact Milda Minter, pasofinotrainer@gmail.com, 336-225-0214, to reserve.

STABLING: Stalls are permanent 10 ft x 10 ft with full doors. All stalls have matted floors and individual fans. Aisles are concrete. Stalls must not be altered or damaged in any way and are subject to charge of additional fees for exhibitors for repair and replacement of parts if stalls are not left in their original condition. Stabling location for the show is at the discretion of show management. Use of stalls other than those assigned to you by show management will result in additional fees being charged.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used

regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deus and quadrille classes; and 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

VENDOR SPACES: Vendor spaces are available for the entire weekend in the vendor hall attached to the show arena. Contact the show chair for pricing and to reserve space.

VETERINARIAN: Tryon Equine Hospital and Ambulatory Services, 828-894-6065. The facility is 15 minutes from the TIEC and includes a full surgical hospital. Located at 3689 Landrum Rd, Columbus, NC.

PIEDMONT BREEDER'S FUTURITY

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS AND HOW TO ENTER

The Piedmont Futurity Committee proposed some revisions to the Futurity Program that were designed to create more enthusiasm and participation in the futurity program. These changes were approved by the Piedmont PFHA membership.

2025 MODIFICATIONS CONTINUED FOR 2026

***Futurity horses may be nominated and entered up to 5pm on Friday, June 19, the day before the futurity classes start.** Nomination fees can be paid at the show through the show secretary.

*We have waived the declaration fee for the 2026 Futurity.

*The 49-60 month fillies, colts, and geldings will all compete in one futurity class in each division: fino, performance, and pleasure (similar to the national program). This change in effect doubles the available prize money for the winners and creates more competition. These 3 classes will be non-point classes.

*We reduced the nomination fee for the 49-60 months riding classes to \$250 if the eligible horse has not been previously nominated into the futurity program. This fee is not due if a horse was nominated as a younger horse.

*We are allowing a gelding to show as a 6 year old in the 61-84 month class if it did not previously show as a 5 year old.

*We reduced the nomination fee for 61-84 month geldings to \$100 (if not previously nominated as a younger horse).

- *fill out the Futurity Application for 2026 for each horse you are entering into the futurity. Make sure to indicate which class your horse will compete in (one of the classes listed above).
- *if your horse has not been previously nominated, you will need to pay the nomination fee listed on the application. If your horse was nominated in a previous year, you will only owe the class entry fee. **NEW FOR 2026**—this can be paid at the show through the show secretary.
- *you **MUST** enter the appropriate class number and pay the normal class entry fee with the show secretary on the standard PFHA entry form.
- *ABSOLUTE DEADLINE FOR FUTURITY NOMINATIONS AND ENTRIES IS FRIDAY, JUNE 19, AT 5PM—NO EXCEPTIONS!!**
- *make sure to show up for your futurity class, as there are **NO REFUNDS** allowed for nomination fees.

RULES FOR NON-POINT CLASSES

- Only eligible and futurity nominated horses may enter these 3 classes. A horse may enter only 1 of these classes in a specific year.
- *class 262 will follow all show rules for the PFHA pleasure division.
 - *class 294 will follow all show rules for the PFHA performance division.
 - *class 300 will follow all show rules for the PFHA fino division.

A horse's age is determined under PFHA current show rules. A gelding may only show in the 61-84 month class one time, either as a 5 year old or 6 year old. All nominated horses must be registered with PFHA and must be nominated and shown under their full registered names and numbers.
