Please read this prize list in its entirety so you can be familiar with our rules and regulations. It contains important information regarding the facility and the show. This show is hosted and sponsored by the Piedmont Paso Fino Horse Association, www.piedmontpasofino.com. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management, whose decision shall be final. Trainers and exhibitors are responsible for knowing the rules regarding their classes.

SHOW SECRETARY: Andy Smith, Nicholasville, KY. **Entries must be received by Tuesday, Oct 29, 2024.** Entries received after Oct 29 will pay a \$25 late fee per horse. Entries may be emailed; scan and send to andysmithpkt@yahoo.com. You may also enter at the show and pay the late fee.

To submit entries, include the following documentation:

PFHA Entry Form and signature page (available to print at www.pfha.org under “forms”)

Copy of PFHA horse registration, copies of PFHA membership cards for all owners and riders

Copy of current Coggins test (must be within 1 year of last day of show)

Credit card authorization form (may be replaced with a check at the show check-in)

Health Certificate (within 30 days) for out-of-state horses—bring to show office at check-in

When you submit your entry packet by the October 29 deadline, you must enter at least one class per horse and have all documentation completed in order to avoid the late fee. You may add additional classes at the show at the regular entry fee.

FEE SCHEDULE FOR ALL HORSES

Stalls: \$100, includes 2 bags of shavings (arrival Friday, Nov 1, departure by Mon, Nov 4)

NO ARRIVALS ARE ALLOWED BEFORE FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 1, AT 8:00 am.

Extra Shavings: \$9.00 per bag (order through barn manager)

Entry Fee: \$35 per class or championship

Youth Entry Fee: \$25 per class or championship

Walk-Corto Lead Line: free (entry must be made through show secretary)

Late Fee: \$25 per horse (one time fee for horses entered after October 29)

Office Fee: \$15 per horse (one time fee per horse entered in the show)

Grounds Fee: \$25 per horse per day (for horses not using stalls, showing out of trailer)

RV space: \$45 per night (full hookups) (reserve through the barn manager)

Sale Horse Fee: \$50 per horse (includes participation in both sales presentations on Saturday and the sales class on Sunday). Free for Piedmont members. (does not include stall or show expenses) Contact Vickie McQuinn, vickiemcquinn@gmail.com, 559-377-0155 to sign up. Please include this fee on your entry form. Non-showing sale horses must still have an entry form and signature page on file. Owners must provide written information (2 minute max) to be read during the presentations.

DIRECTIONS TO THE FACILITY

From I-20 in SC, take exit #101. Go south on Dr Humphries Rd for 3-4/10 mile. Turn left onto Cleveland School Rd, go for 3/10 mile and look for SC Equine Park at 443 Cleveland School Rd.

IMPORTANT SHOW INFORMATION FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

Pay close attention to your class numbers to make sure you enter the proper classes for your division. All classes will be conducted and judged under current Paso Fino Horse Association rules and regulations. Class splits may be made when appropriate in the case of conflict of rider with 2 horses (as in schooling classes, aged gelding classes, etc) but **exhibitors must notify the show secretary of the need for a split at the time the show entries are made.** In this case the class will be split into A and B sections with divisions according to PFHA rules, and all other exhibitors will be notified of the changes. If classes are split, they will follow PFHA rules regarding ages (36-48 months or 49-60 months for schooling age, 61-84 months or 85 months & older for aged horses).

Pay attention to paddock announcements. Some classes will be very small or have no exhibitors, so at times the schedule will move very fast. We will make every attempt to make sure exhibitors are notified of classes in the arena, but exhibitors are responsible for being ready to show when their classes are called to the arena. Once classes are called into the arena, there will be a short gate hold, and then the gate will close. Once the entry gate has been closed, additional horses will not be permitted to enter and the class will be judged with those present. **Entry fees will not be refunded in the case of missed classes.** If you need to scratch a class or classes, please notify the paddock master or show secretary before your class is due to enter the ring. Entry fees may be credited to your account if scratches are made in a timely manner before the class runs.

Paperwork should be submitted to the show secretary at the time entries are made, including entry form and signature pages, registration copies, membership card numbers for owners and exhibitors, and coggins tests (within 1 year). **A 30-day Health Certificate will be required for any horse coming from outside of SC for the show**, and this must be brought with the horse and shown upon arrival to the show grounds and upon check in at the show office. If you did not pre-enter by sending all documentation to the show secretary, all paperwork must be brought to the show in order to complete your entries.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

ADMISSION OF HORSES: Stalls will be available on Friday, November 1, 2024 (no arrivals before 10 am) and must be vacated by Monday, November 4, 2024, at 10:00 am. Horses may be stabled only in the stalls designated for their owner by show management. Use of other stalls not designated to you may result in additional fees. Horses on the grounds but not using stalls must pay the daily grounds fee. **No arrivals before Friday, November 1, at 10:00 am!!**

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT: It is important to PFHA that everyone involved in our shows and events has the best experience possible. If you have any needs or ADA accessibility issues which we could address in advance to make your experience better, please contact the show chairman.

ARENA/WORK HOURS: The facility and arenas will be open on Friday afternoon and Saturday and Sunday, when not in use for the horse show or scheduled exhibitions or demos. Facility rules dictate that horses may not be lunged in either of the covered arenas or the outdoor show arenas. There are dedicated areas for lunging horses.

CAMPERS/RVS: Make reservations with the barn manager for RV spaces. Campers and RVs must be parked in designated areas. Any vehicle connected to water and/or electricity will be considered a camper and will be charged the camper fee. Campfires are not allowed. Generators are not allowed. Campers and RV's will not be permitted to park around the barns.

CHANGES/CANCELLATIONS: Management reserves the right to combine, cancel, or run concurrently any class or classes as needed for the show, or to reschedule classes after notification to exhibitors. Management also reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show. Management is not responsible for cancellations due to severe weather or other emergencies.

CLASS CALLS: Every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system. However, due to unforeseen problems with any mechanical device, the PA system and paddock calls must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his/her horse is at the gate at the prescribed time.

COGGINS/HEALTH PAPERS: In accordance with South Carolina state law, all horses on the grounds must have a current negative Coggins test certificate (within 12 months). A copy of the certificate must be on file in the show office. In addition, a copy must be posted on the stall door for inspection by the State Veterinarian. All non-showing horses on the grounds must be listed on an entry blank and present a coggins certificate (and health cert if from out-of-state) as listed above. Any horse not in compliance must be removed from the grounds—no exceptions! A health certificate dated within 30 days of the end of the show is required for all out of state horses.

DAMAGE: The SC Equine Park holds individual owners and exhibitors responsible for damages incurred by them or their agents to barns or other properties on the show grounds and will bill them accordingly. The Piedmont PFHA, the Piedmont Fall Fiesta Horse Show, and the show management, personnel, or volunteers will in no way be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. It will be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, its management, and the SC Equine Park blameless for any loss or accident to his/her horse(s) or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise. The Piedmont Fall Fiesta Horse Show, show management or personnel, or the SC Equine Park will not be responsible or liable for injuries sustained in any way to exhibitors, spectators, employees, or any other interested parties.

DISABILITY: If an individual needs an accommodation under the American Disabilities Act, please submit the request, along with the documentation of the disability and need for accommodation, to the show chairman.

DISCOURTESY: Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom, may disqualify the horse and cause the owner to forfeit his/her entry fee and other fees and be removed from the grounds. This show and the Piedmont PFHA Board of Directors do support and will enforce all PFHA and USEF rules regarding sportsmanship, conduct, and courtesy at all PFHA recognized shows or events. Any violations committed will be subject to appropriate PFHA and USEF penalties.

DISPOSAL OF MEDICAL WASTE: Sharps containers are provided in convenient locations throughout the barns for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. Show management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal.

DOGS ON COMPETITION GROUNDS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained at all times. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted on a horse.

EMERGENCY CARE: info will be posted at the show office

ENTRIES: Entries must be received by Tuesday, October 29, to avoid paying a late fee. Entries must be complete and include signatures and a credit card authorization form. A check may be substituted at the show as payment so long as a CC authorization form has been submitted with the entries. See the first page of the prize list for submission information.

HOLD HARMLESS: Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to him/her, his/her horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise. All exhibitors must sign a release form.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: Only persons with a valid driver's license from their state of residence will be permitted to operate any motorized vehicle, including but not limited to golf carts, mopeds, scooters, or farm utility vehicles while on the show grounds. Sanctions and penalties may be imposed upon the parent, guardian, or trainer of any minors who violate this policy.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: If horses are on the show grounds for any reason that are not entered in the show, those horses must meet all health requirements required by the show, including coggins tests, and health papers (if from out of state). All non-showing horses must be listed on an entry form with the show office.

PARKING: Horse trailer parking is not permitted in the barn area. Horse trailers and vans must be parked in designated trailer parking areas. At all times a fire lane around the barns must be kept clear. Any vehicles blocking emergency access may be towed at the owner's expense.

QUESTIONS: Any and all questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management, whose decision shall be final.

REFUNDS: Owners will be responsible for payment of stall fees unless a refund request is accompanied by a veterinarian excuse before arrival at the show grounds. If the horse is on the show grounds already, class refunds will be given for scratched classes but full stall fee must be paid.

RETURNED CHECKS OR DECLINED CREDIT CARDS: All checks returned for non-payment, or credit cards that are declined, will be charged a handling fee and must be replaced by cash, certified check, or cashier's check within 2 weeks of notification.

SHAVINGS: Each stall is priced with 2 bags of shavings included. Additional shavings may be purchased through show management. **No outside shavings are allowed to be brought onto the show grounds.**

SHOW OFFICE: The show office will open on Saturday afternoon at 2 pm and on Sunday at 8am. You may add or switch classes with the show secretary at least 5 classes ahead of the class you are adding or deleting. All exhibitors should check out at the show office after completing their classes.

SPONSORSHIPS: Class sponsorships are available at \$25 per class or 5 classes for \$100. Farm sponsorships are \$150 which includes 5 classes and banner placement in the arena.

STABLING: Stalls are 10 x 10 ft permanent with sliding or swinging doors with matted floors. Stalls must not be altered or damaged in any way and are subject to charge of additional fees for exhibitors for repair and replacement of parts if stalls are not left in their original condition. Stabling location for the show is at the discretion of show management. Use of stalls other than those assigned to you by show management will result in additional fees being charged.

VENDOR SPACES: Vendor Spaces are available for the entire weekend for \$100 for a space without electrical hookup, or for \$150 for a space with electrical hookup. The cost for a vehicle or trailer space is \$200 for the weekend. Contact the show chairman to reserve.

VETERINARIANS: The name(s) of veterinarian on call will be posted at the show office and in the barns
